

LiteShow Key Manager 1.3

LiteShow Key Manager is a utility that creates a LiteShow_Setup.ini file which is used by the LiteShow installation program at install time. This configuration file contains information that will allow the LiteShow installation program to do the following:

- Allows for a "silent" install of LiteShow Manager (no user required inputs). This is often used by administrators when performing an unattended install on multiple computers.
- Pre-configure security settings (WEP or WPA keys) for up to 100 LiteShow II Adapters during installation.

After the LiteShow_Setup.ini is created, it can be placed in the same file location as the LiteShow_Setup.exe installation program. At installation runtime, the LiteShow installer will use the configuration settings in the INI file to install LiteShow Manager.

If you wish to pre-configure LiteShow Manager to contain the WEP and WPA keys for LiteShow II adapters, it will be necessary to use the LiteShow Key Manager utility. These keys will be added into the LiteShow_Setup.ini file in an encrypted format. Even though LiteShow Key Manager uses a proprietary encryption format for these values, we highly encourage safe and secure handling of this file by authorized personnel.

LiteShow Key Manager Options:

SSID

Enter the value of the LiteShow II Adapter wireless network name.

Key

Enter the actual WEP or WPA key value used for the LiteShow II adapter. The following types of keys are supported:

WEP-64 Keys in either ASCII or HEX values.

WEP-128 Keys in either ASCII or HEX values

WPA Keys in ASCII format.

Key Format

Select the type of key. WEP or WPA keys are allowed.

SAVING & EDITING LiteShow_Setup.ini FILES:

Once you are done configuring your LiteShow II Adapter devices in the LiteShow Key Manager. Save the configuration settings with the File > Save option. The plain text WEP keys will be encrypted and placed into the INI file.

It is possible to edit the LiteShow_Setup.ini file with the LiteShow Key Manager, however any previously entered WEP keys will no longer be visible in clear text. You may add new keys, but the previously saved keys will display as a series of asterisk's "****". If you need to change one of those keys, it will be necessary to erase and re-enter the key.

The LiteShow_Setup.ini file uses the following options:

[Setup]
QUICK=Yes
PATH=%ProgramFiles%\InFocus\LiteShow II
DeskTopTShortcut=Yes
RegWebSite=No
[AdapterList]
```

Option	Values	Description
QUICK	Yes, No	If Yes, then silent install is performed.
PATH	<path>	The installation path where LiteShow Manager will be installed.
DeskTopShortCut	Yes, No	If Yes, places a shortcut icon for LiteShow Manager on the Desktop.
RegWebSite	Yes, No	If Yes, Display the InFocus registration website after installation.
